Making it yours

1. **Name your token.** Tie it to your mascot or expectations acronym so the language matches what students already hear (SOARing birds, PAWS tickets, Bulldog Bucks).
2. **Set a reachable number.** Ten is a common starting point for a class goal — close enough that students see progress within a week or two.
3. **Keep the reward blank.** Filling it in with the class, or pulling it from the choice board, gives students a voice and keeps the system fresh.
4. **Post it where students can see it.** The goal poster and the running tally should live side by side.

Class Reward Choice Board

Eight low-cost, low-prep options students choose from when the class hits its goal. Swap options each quarter to keep interest high.

Ideas to pull from

Free or nearly free: extra recess · show and tell · hat day · stuffed animal day · frozen treat · lunch in the classroom · use markers · crazy hair day · class dance break · sit anywhere day · teacher reads a chapter · sunglasses inside · line leader for the day · music while working · extra library visit · class game time.

Tip: Ask students to nominate options at the start of each quarter. Choices students picked themselves are far more motivating than choices adults picked for them.
